



2010 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Health Insurance Reform

The Medical Association of Georgia (MAG) will pursue broad-based insurance reform legislation that expands Georgia's prompt pay statute to third party administrators and requires disclosure of "rental networks" that are often inappropriately used by health insurance plans.

Trauma Care Funding

Support a continuous and dedicated source of funding to establish a statewide trauma system.

Medicaid

Support reforms that ensure the adequacy of payment to physicians, reduce the administrative burdens, benefit the physician-patient relationship and promote the practice of quality medicine in Georgia.

Protect Tort Reform

Retain the remaining elements of the tort reform bill passed in 2005 including the cap on non-economic damages.
