**Georgia Physicians Leadership Academy  
Class XIV Call for Nominations**

Effective physician association leadership will continue to be critical for our patients and our profession as health care systems continue to evolve. This competitive program provides leadership skills training and access to a growing professional network to help enable emerging physician leaders in Georgia to make a real difference through organized medicine. We invite your nominations for Class XIV.

**What is the Georgia Physicians Leadership Academy (GPLA)?**

The GPLA, a subsidiary of the Medical Association of Georgia (MAG) Foundation, is designed to prepare physicians who want to improve health care delivery for their patients, communities and the medical profession. Interactive classes will enable physicians to enhance their leadership skills and develop continuing relationships with colleagues. This in-depth, year-long program includes six sessions that take place on weekends with one day (Advocacy) scheduled on a weekday. This is a great opportunity for your medical society to train an emerging leader. Class members who fully participate will earn AMA PRA Category 1 Credits.

**What are the 2022-23 program dates? What is the curriculum?**

**Please note: Attendance is required for Session 1**

Over the first decade of GPLA, the leadership of the MAG Foundation and GPLA have observed the importance of members to participate in this session. The content is critical as it sets the foundation for the entire year where *physician leadership* is the common denominator across the entire curriculum. Also, this is where participants will begin to network and develop rapport with classmates and alumni.

**Session 1 Saturday, May 7, 2022 (concurrent to MAG Board of Directors meeting)  
Saturday, 8:30a.m. - 3:00p.m.**

**"GPLA Orientation: Physician Leadership Strategies"**

This session will start with a class introduction to the MAG Board of Directors at their May meeting and will continue with the graduation of GPLA Class XIII and leadership project presentations by the graduating class. The afternoon session will include an overview of the program format and leadership project guidelines, commencing with a welcome reception and dinner (one guest/spouse invited).

**MAG Legislative Education Seminar (Optional)  
May 13-15, 2022, Brasstown Valley Resort**

While not an official GPLA session, the timing of this meeting is perfect for class members to meet, mingle, network and learn first-hand from MAG physician leaders, legislators, MAG staff and others.

**Session 2 August 27-28, 2022**

**“Media, Communication and Collaboration in the Medical Environment” and  
“Parliamentary Procedure” TBD**

This two-day educational retreat will include media training and communication techniques. The Saturday session is a full day to include presentations from invited Georgia physician legislators. Leadership development will continue on Sunday morning – including case studies and an introduction to the value of parliamentary rules of order - the body of rules, ethics and customs governing meetings of organizations or associations - will highlight strategies to negotiate conflicts between physician associations and other entities.

**Annual GPLA Gathering Friday evening, October 22, 2022 (optional)**

**GPLA Alumni Reception at MAG House of Delegates**

While attendance at the MAG House of Delegates is not mandatory, MAG encourages all GPLA alumni and current class members to attend. You’ll have a front seat for the HOD process and possibly serve as a Reference Committee Chair or member. This is where your investment in GPLA really comes to light!

**Session 3 November 5-6, 2023, at MAG HQ**

**“Conflict Resolution” and “Physician Resilience”**

Topics will include making decisions in difficult situations, resolving conflicts and negotiating effectively. Physician resilience and wellbeing is a MAG priority. You’ll become familiar with resources and tools to help physicians become champions who collaborate with their clinical teams.

**Session 4 January 7-8, 2023, at MAG HQ**

**“Advocacy Skills Workshop” and “Health Care Economics”**

This two-part session includes an overview of MAG and the effective strategies for physician leaders. Its focus is the importance of collaboration between medical societies, interactive instruction of the legislative process and developing effective personal advocacy skills. Get a better understanding of health economics and how it’s related to health care policy. You’ll receive an overview of the U.S. macroeconomy and its relationship to the U.S. health care system.

**Session 5 February 27-28, 2023**

**"Advocacy Day at the Capitol"**

**Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup> at 5:30p.m.: Dinner with your legislator; location TBD.**

**Tuesday, February 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:30a.m.:** Following an early morning update on current issues, the class will meet with MAG's government relations team and elected officials at the State Capitol for a full day of political action.

**Session 6 May 2023 (TBD):**

**Graduation (concurrent to MAG Board of Directors meeting)** and new class orientation at MAG HQ. Graduation will include leadership project presentations and recognition of each graduate.

**What is the *Leadership Project*?** All Academy class physicians will commit to completing a personal leadership project to benefit their patients, communities, specialty and/or state societies during their class year. The Leadership Project should be a vehicle to both develop personal leadership skills and to have a positive impact on an area of interest to the participant. Project examples might include planning a membership drive, developing a health awareness and/or patient education program for the local community or collaborating with colleagues on a legislative advocacy campaign, among others. The facilitators and GPLA staff are available to discuss appropriate leadership projects. Physicians are encouraged to request support from mentors and GPLA alumni.

**What is the tuition fee?** The tuition fee is \$1100.00. The sponsoring organization is expected to provide this funding which will be used to offset lodging and meals. Transportation costs will be the responsibility of each attendee. Each physician accepted into the Academy must be nominated by a supporting organization. Supporting organizations are county medical societies, specialty societies, or similar units of organized medicine.

**How do I apply?** Candidates must be nominated by a county, district, or medical specialty society or a MAG-related entity. Self-nomination is not permitted. If a sponsoring organization nominates more than one physician, the organization is requested to prioritize its nominees. In the absence of a rank order when multiple candidates are being advanced by one organization, nominees will be considered in alphabetical order. Sections A,B and C of the nomination form must be completed.

**What is the attendance policy?** Candidates must agree to participate in all elements of the Leadership Development Program as noted in the program outline. If a participant misses a session, make-up assignments will be at the discretion of the GPLA Chair to include:

1. Participant performing make-up work to determine proficiency in the topic of the missed curriculum
2. Participant attending the missed session(s) the following year or may require the entire GPLA program to be repeated prior to graduation
3. Participant missing more than one session, absent a waiver from the Steering Committee, will NOT be allowed to graduate from the GPLA.

Consideration will be given for announced dates that are changed during the year. CME credits will be awarded only for attending sessions where accredited hours are offered. MAG reserves the right to change meeting venues.

**Are spouses invited?** One of the greatest challenges to physician participation in organized medicine is the time conflict posed by significant absence from family activities. To increase understanding of the importance of organized medicine and support for mutual commitments, spouses are encouraged (not required) to attend all sessions.
